### General University constraints:

- 1) In the GE Segment III requirements, at least one course must be outside the major, and only two courses from the cluster can be double-counted in both Segment III and major. Also, a maximum of 12 units used to meet GE requirements may also be used to fulfill major requirements.
- 2) Students must have a minimum 2.0 (C) grade point average in their major in order to graduate.

- 3) Students may take no more than 30% of all undergraduate units for CR/NC (credit/noncredit) grades.

**Single Subject Matter Program Notes:**

- 1) Only courses in which students earn a B- or better will count toward subject matter competency for admission into a California credential program. Students who earn lower grades in any of the courses required for their major will need to take the California Subject Examination for Teachers (CSET) to establish subject matter competency.
- 2) Courses for subject matter competency may not be taken CR/NC.

**Important change for all English major and minor students:**

As of Spring 2013, the minimum grade acceptable in a course for the major is a C-with the exception of ENG 480GW — Junior Seminar GWAR, which requires a minimum grade of a C. The minimum grade point average for the major remains 2.0. If you have any questions, please see your faculty advisor.
