Individual Major:

Students who wish to enroll in an Individual Major will do the Core plus a 24-unit course of study worked out in continual, close consultation with an Individual Program Advisor. The Individual Major will only be available to students who can define a course of study in a serious and coherent way.

General University constraints:

- 1) In the GE Segment III requirements, at least one course must be outside the major, and only two courses from the cluster can be double-counted in both Segment III and major. Also, a maximum of 12 units used to meet GE requirements may also be used to fulfill major requirements.

- 2) Students must have a minimum 2.0 (C) grade point average in their major in order to graduate.
- 3) Students may take no more than 30% of all undergraduate units for CR/NC (credit/noncredit) grades.

Important change for all English major and minor students

As of Spring 2013, the minimum grade acceptable in a course for the major is a C- with the exception of ENG 480GW — Junior Seminar GWAR, which requires a minimum grade of a C. The minimum grade point average for the major remains 2.0. If you have any questions, please see your faculty advisor.
